






Feast of Corpus Christi—Sunday June 18th— Eucharistic Procession

HURRICANE SEASON 2017

June 1—November 30

The World Meteorological Organization said the names Matthew and Otto are being removed from the Atlantic name list. They're the 81st and 82nd names to be removed. Names are retired when a storm is so deadly or destructive that future use of its name would be insensitive.

Matthew became a category 5 storm and at one point was one of the most powerful storms on record in the Caribbean. Most of the deaths were in Haiti before heading up the east cost of Florida and causing sever beach erosion and leading to the deaths of more than 40 people in four states.

Otto was a late-season tropical cyclone that made landfall in Nicaragua. It crossed over the Atlantic to the Pacific Ocean, causing 18 deaths as it crossed Central America.

Martin and Owen will replace Matthew and Otto when the 2016 Atlantic storm name list is used again in 2022.
